



J Dr. Richard Cho is the Chief Executive Officer of the Connecticut Coalition to End Homelessness. From 2013 to 2016, Cho served as the Deputy Director at the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness where he was responsible for coordinating the efforts across 19 federal departments to implement Opening Doors, the federal strategic plan to end and prevent homelessness in America. Prior to his current role, Richard was the Director of Behavioral Health at the Council of State Governments where he oversaw the Stepping Up Initiative and helped lead national efforts to improve police interactions with people with mental health needs, and to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails, including helping to increase connections to stable housing. Richard received his Ph.D. from the New York University Robert F Wagner School of Public Service.
