She received a 2019 MacArthur Fellowship for her criminal justice reform work most notably her role as the primary architect of LEAD—Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion/Let Everyone Advance with Dignity. The

LEAD program, which diverts individuals suspected of low-level offenses related to behavioral health conditions and poverty away from criminal-legal involvement and toward supportive services, has been replicated in over 60 metropolitan areas in the United States. Lisa has also served as Seattle's Community Police Commission co-chair from 2013-2018 and Commissioner until 2019. She obtained her J.D. from Yale Law School.
